Whatever you do, please don't tell me hat it is prime riding season right now!
Unlike last summer when I seemed to have ample time to ride, this year has been a story of missed opportunities. I popped some new rubber on SKWERL over a week (or was it two?) ago, and it still has all

of the little nubbins on it. And for the wise-crackers in the audience, I mean beyond the ones I normally leave on the edges of my tires. lupe Mountains and Carlsbad Caverns. That included a very long stretch with no gas stations. I'll just leave it at that!

Continuing on, I stopped in Roswell, NM, which is home to several interesting attractions including a nice Harley dealership.

Now I have another tee shirt to wear to club functions! I believe I also stopped over in White Sands, but couldn't see it due to the winds.

My main destination was the Trinity Site, where the first atomic bomb was detonated. This National Monument is only open two days a year and my last attempt was thwarted due to 9/11. There are still a few trips on the schedule for this year, so if things go according to plan, I should at least celebrate SKWERL's 70th later this year. According to Acorn, this is a given, because I still have to fulfill my duty to take him to the White Squirrel Festival in Ontario later this summer!

I *heart* Nevada Roads

Leaving Tonopah eastbound on US6, there's a small, blue sign that states "Next service 153 miles." And even that's not completely correct. If you make the turn at Warm Springs and proceed south on NV375, and if the lone Shell station at Ash Springs isn't open yet, then it's about 260 miles without services. Even in Nevada, with the higher speed limits on rural roads, that's almost four hours.

I *heart* Nevada Roads.

Most people dislike Nevada roads. They think they go on straight for as long as the eye can see. There's no cell service nor radio reception. There's virtually no other traffic. There are no "bio" facilities. And with no place to stop, the scenery can get repetitive. But do it on a motorcycle!

The roads really don't go straight for hours. In fact, Nevada is full of ridges, mountains and passes, and the rider has to regularly downshift for the climb and manage speed during the descents. Beautiful sweeping turns, clean and virtually new from lack of use,



and with no conflicting traffic – It's riding nirvana. How could you be bored?

Most of Nevada has open ranges in which cattle and mustangs roam freely. Mustangs tend to keep their distance and are magnificent to behold. Cows aren't as bright. They will look at you approaching a mile away, and meander into (!) the roadway. One even stopped in the middle of the road to stare me down. He (she?) won. I slowed down and passed with plenty of space – I didn't want to spook him and have the idiot bolt into me.

Their calves, on the other hand, weren't just smart to run from passing traffic, they were also quite cute with white fluffy balls of fur covering their running and leaping hoofs.

The plants across the high desert are also attention grabbing – Some are tall and others are short, some are broad and some are thin, but all have distinctive shapes from years of brutal wind and sun. The more unusual are grossly disfigured from growing around

the tumbleweed that rolled into them – Just look around; there are amazing shapes to see in every quadrant. Nature's version of Bonsai.

Whether cresting a pass or passing through a long valley, rock formations lining your periphery range from gray in the north to red in the south, again all weathered by years of erosion. Shapes appear if you give them a chance. And if you happen to pass them during sunrise or sunset, the colors and shadows are distractingly beautiful!

Lastly, man-made objects in the middle of nowhere provide visual entertainment. There's a microwave relay station alongside the Lower Pahranagat Lake makes you wonder how much usage it gets. The poorly maintained ranch road that departs at a perfect 90 degrees goes beyond the horizon – Why is it there and who uses it? What's back there? Few people know that white building near Coaldale isn't an LDS temple, but an aviation VORTAC. But my favorite is, and will always be the nondescript mailbox south of Rachel that indicates the entrance to Area 51. I've been told, but never verified, that just as the dusty, dirt road goes out of view of NV375, that a *very* fortified entrance blocks further discovery. And so, 240 miles later, my low fuel light, indicating fuel exhaustion, came on. Internally, another light indicated visual exhaustion – Fortunately, a planned gas stop is just 20 more miles down the road. What a great ride!

About an hour afterwards I'm departing Nevada and someone has painted in big block letters "WE MISS YOU ALREADY" on a roadside water tank. The feeling is mutual as I descend into California and its poorly maintained and busier roads, slower speed limits and, well, civilization. I think I'll return soon!


